There are currently 31 certified batterers' intervention programs in the state of Tennessee. At the December Council meeting, a new program was certified—Active Solutions, Inc—which will bring BIP services into Montgomery County, a county that did not have certified BIP classes.

In September, the Council's designee was invited to be a member of a multidisciplinary panel about domestic violence in honor of the International Day of Peace. The Council's designee is also working with Prevent Child Abuse Tennessee to provide domestic violence training to new employees of the Department of Children's Services Child Abuse Hotline.

Six trainings were held this reporting session; five in person and one in online format. Those training sessions had the following outcomes:

- 99% agreed or strongly agreed that the training had a clearly defined purpose.
- 97% agreed or strongly agreed that they learned a great deal in the training session.
- 99% agreed or strongly agreed that they will apply what they learned back on their job.
- 99% agreed or strongly agreed that they were satisfied with the training they received.

Some of the action steps identified by training participants included:

- "[I will] be more mindful of my patients."
- "[I will] be proactive in signing up for required training."
- "I will know the type of questions to ask to further understand the situation during a call."
- "Becoming more educated in my work in order to better aid the children & families in need."
- "[I will] take care not to blame the victim, be supportive."
- "[I will] increase program accountability."
- "We are preparing to apply for certification."

The Council's designee completed the following actions during this reporting period:

- Provided technical assistance to 27 Batterers' Intervention Programs.
- Responded to 278 technical assistance calls and emails from law enforcement, courts, batterers' intervention programs, victim advocates, and others.
- Disseminated 7,757 individual communications to Council members, law enforcement, courts, batterers' intervention programs, victim advocates, and others.
- Provided 960 communications, including technical assistance and information sharing, to Batterers' Intervention Programs on a listserv for certified programs.

**Welcome:**

General Rachel Willis called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. CST. Members of the Council and guests introduced themselves.

**Review and Approve Minutes:**

General Willis requested that the Council review the minutes from the June 3, 2016 meeting. Deborah Yeomans-Barton moved that the June 3, 2016 minutes be approved, and Tina Fox seconded the motion. All members were in favor and the minutes were approved.

**Executive Committee Report:**

General Willis presented the Executive Committee report. The committee has not met since the last Council meeting, but the minutes from the May 31, 2016 meeting are in the members' packets for review.

**Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report:**

Tina Fox presented the Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report. One program has applied for initial certification and five have applied for recertification.

- Program applying for certification

Active Solutions, Inc has applied for initial certification. The application is complete except for a letter from the local domestic violence services documenting a collaborative working relationship. This application will be reviewed again for the December meeting.

- Programs applying for recertification.

Probation Works, Inc, in Memphis was successfully monitored in May and has submitted a complete recertification application. Tina Fox made a motion to recertify Probation Works, Inc., which was seconded by Deborah Yeomans-Barton. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

PSI II in Memphis was successfully monitored in May and has submitted a complete recertification application. Tina Fox moved to recertify PSI II, and the motion was seconded by Evelyn Gaines-Guzman. The motion was passed with all members in favor.

Lighthouse Correctional Counseling and Mental Health Services in Murfreesboro submitted a complete recertification application. Tina Fox moved that the organization be recertified, which was seconded by Lana Roberts. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Kelly Miller Smith Center in Nashville was monitored on September 12, 2016 and was found to have one corrective action; their class did not meet the ninety-minute minimum set forth in the Rules. The Council Chair proposed that voting on the recertification of the Kelly Miller Smith Center be postponed until further monitoring could be completed to determine if this has been corrected. The members were in agreement.

Behavioral Treatment Providers, Inc in Nashville was successfully monitored at the end of August, and submitted a complete recertification application. Tina Fox moved that Behavioral Treatment Providers, Inc be recertified, which was seconded by Jeanne Broadwell. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Six BIPs have been monitored since the last Council Meeting: Blount County Probation in Maryville; Lighthouse Counseling and Life Skills Center: Abuse Intervention with Life Skills in Chattanooga; Abuse Alternatives in Bristol; First Tennessee Human Resources Agency in Johnson City; Behavioral Treatment Providers in Nashville; and Kelly Miller Smith Center in Nashville. A follow up observation was also done on Correctional Management Systems in Nashville. There is currently one upcoming monitoring visit scheduled for Tennessee Community Counseling Services in Chattanooga. Additional visits will be scheduled in Crossville, Nashville and additional areas as needed.

#### **Emerging Issues & Order of Protection Committee Report:**

Deborah Yeomans-Barton presented the Emerging Issues & Order of Protection Committee report. The committee met this morning and discussed changes to the order of protection documents to accommodate 2016 legislative changes in the statutes. They also discussed which court should have jurisdiction in situations in which a juvenile is a part of an order of protection proceeding.

A copy of the letter to the District Attorney Generals regarding the violation of ex parte orders of protection and copies of the 2006 and 2014 Attorney General's opinions were included in the members' packets for review. The letter and opinions will be sent out to the District Attorney Generals on Council letterhead with Deborah's signature as Vice-Chair.

**Training Committee Report:**

Mary Rose Zingale presented the Training Committee report. A draft of the survey to assess domestic violence training needs is in the packets for review. Please send any additional ideas to Bethanie by the end of the month. The domestic violence bench cards will be distributed at the Judicial Conferences.

**Other Business:**

The Coalition's Pearls & Pinstripes Gala is on September 30. Information on how to purchase tickets may be found on the invitation in each member's packet.





**Welcome:**

General Rachel Willis called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. CST. Everyone in the room introduced themselves.

**Review and Approve Minutes:**

General Willis requested that the Council review the minutes from the September 16, 2016 meeting. Deborah Yeomans-Barton moved that the minutes be approved, and Jeanne Broadwell seconded the motion. All members were in favor and the minutes were approved.

**Executive Committee Report:**

General Willis reported that the executive committee has not met since the last Council meeting.

**Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report:**

Tina Fox presented the Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report. Five programs have submitted complete applications for recertification, and two programs have submitted all the materials required for initial certification.

- **Program applying for certification:**

Active Solutions, Inc applied for initial certification. The application was complete at the September Council meeting except for the letters of support from the local domestic violence program. They now have a letter of support from Urban Ministries in Clarksville and the Department of the Army. Tina Fox made the motion to certify Active Solutions, Inc, which was seconded by Melanie Bean. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Successful Survivors BIP has been working on their initial certification application since 2015. They recently completed all the necessary changes to their application. However, the

Certification and Monitoring Committee had additional questions regarding specific aspects of their application, and have decided to postpone bringing this application to the Council until more information can be gathered.

- Programs applying for recertification:

Kelly Miller Smith Center Against Abusive Behavior's recertification application was postponed until this meeting to allow for further monitoring. Since the last meeting, KMS was monitored twice, and was able to meet the time requirement set forth by the Rules. Tina Fox made a motion to recertify KMS which was seconded by Deborah Yeomans-Barton. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Shelby County Pretrial Services in Memphis has submitted a complete recertification application, and was successfully monitored earlier in the year. Tina Fox moved to recertify Shelby County Pretrial Services, and the motion was seconded by Bobby Vann. The motion was passed with all members in favor.

Avalon Center BIP in Crossville has submitted a complete recertification application and was successfully monitored in October. Tina Fox moved to recertify the program, which was seconded by Mary Rose Zingale. All members were in favor.

Lighthouse Abuse Intervention and Life Skills (AILS) in Chattanooga submitted a complete recertification application and was monitored in August. Tina Fox moved that the organization be recertified, which was seconded by Mary Rose Zingale. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Correctional Management Systems in Nashville has submitted all the materials necessary for the recertification application. Staff members are still in the process of meeting the training requirement set forth in the monitoring report, although the program's performance has greatly improved. Tina Fox moved that Correctional Management Systems be recertified with the provision that the staff members complete the training requirement given in the corrective actions in nine months from today's date. Deborah Yeomans-Barton seconded, and the Council approved the motion.

Since the last Council meeting, two BIPs were monitored: Avalon in Crossville and Tennessee Community Counseling Services in Chattanooga. Two follow up observations were also done on Kelly Miller Smith Center Against Abusive Behavior.

There were five training approval requests made since the last Council meeting. Lynda Lawson from Managing Emotions Nonviolently requested that "Master the Art of Persuasion and Negotiation" presented by Chris Crouch at the Alliance for Better Nonprofits be approved for three BIP hours. Deborah Yeomans-Barton moved that it be approved for one hour BIP credit, which was seconded by Tina Fox, and the motion was approved.

Jennifer Jackson at Tennessee Community Counseling Services requested approval of a two hour staff training, "Challenging Belief Systems" that used Chapter 5 of the Duluth curriculum. Mary

Rose Zingale moved to approve this training for two hours BIP training credit and the motion was seconded by Tina Fox. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Sarah Cannon with Avalon Center requested approval for an eight hour workshop on BIPs they conducted. Deborah Yeomans-Barton moved to approve the training, which was seconded by Melanie Bean. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Abuse Alternatives requested that "Talk of the Town: Stop the Silence about Domestic Violence" presented by Alyce LaViolette, MS., MFT on October 28, 2016 in Marion, VA be approved for seven BIP hours. Mary Rose Zingale moved that this training be approved, and the motion was seconded by Melanie Bean. The motion passed with all members in favor.

Lighthouse AILS requested that the "Working Together: The Key to Ending Domestic Violence" conference presented by the Consauga Family Violence Alliance on October 14, 2016 be approved for seven BIP hours. The motion to approve was made by Deborah Yeomans-Barton and seconded by Tina Fox. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Bethanie is currently working on the monitoring schedule for 2017. Council members are encouraged to be involved in the monitoring process.

#### **Emerging Issues & Order of Protection Committee Report:**

Deborah Yeomans-Barton presented the Emerging Issues & Order of Protection Committee report. Mary Rose Zingale has been working at the AOC to update the application forms for Orders of Protection to be in line with the new laws coming to effect January 1, 2017. The new forms will be posted on the AOC website. Rebecca Montgomery suggested a webinar be conducted about the new forms and laws.

Deborah Yeomans-Barton also reported that the Washington County Family Justice Center is now able to file petitions for Orders of Protection, and that the courts are moving to a electronic filing system.

There is still some question about the term "actual notice" when it comes to being served with an Order of Protection. Rachel Willis reported that the Tennessee Supreme Court will hear a case regarding this issue in a case of aggravated stalking in February.

#### **Training Committee Report:**

Mary Rose Zingale presented the Training Committee report. A copy of the survey to assess domestic violence training needs is in the packets for review. The survey is online on the Coalition website. It was asked that all members of the Council help with distribution of the survey and/or get the word out about the same.

A question was raised about what agency maintains the data and statistics about domestic violence cases in Tennessee, as well as how data about Orders of Protection is collected and maintained. Jeanne Broadwell offered to look into what the data the TBI collects and report back to the Council at the next meeting.

**Legislative Update:**

Kathy Walsh updated the Council on various issues the Coalition will be looking at during the upcoming session.

**Other Business:**

The 2017 meeting dates are included in the meeting packets.

The Coalition's legal clinic is expanding, and therefore is looking to hire an attorney, a legal advocate, and a legal secretary. Preference will be given to those who can speak Spanish. These new personnel will specifically be working with sexual assault cases across the state. If you know anyone who may be interested in the positions, please refer them to Rebecca Montgomery.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:42a.m. CST.







As of June 5, 2017, there are 31 certified batterers' intervention programs across the state. The last BIP to be certified is the Batterers' Intervention Program at Successful Survivors in Nashville which was certified in March of this year.

On May 4 and 5, 2017 the Council sponsored a training provided by Dr. Ted German from Emerge. Dr. German facilitated the Advanced Curriculum training with sixteen BIP facilitators from across the state. This training is geared toward experienced BIP facilitators so they can grapple with the complexities of group leadership, learn new skills and interventions, and tackle cutting edge issues in the overall field of abuser education.

The Council held a total of fourteen training sessions during this reporting period; eleven in person, two live webinars, and one online self-paced training that participants can complete on their own. Those training sessions had the following outcomes:

- 98% agreed or strongly agreed that the training had a clearly defined purpose.
- 95% agreed or strongly agreed that they learned a great deal in the training session.
- 93% agreed or strongly agreed that they will apply what they learned back on their job.
- 98% agreed or strongly agreed that they were satisfied with the training they received.

Some of the action steps identified by training participants included:

- "[I will] understand that domestic violence can have connections to the child abuse claims I may hear."
- "Yes, I will spread the word about domestic violence and how to prevent it."
- "If I see something, I will say something."
- "[I will] be more understanding in my classes."
- "[I will consider all approaches and notice how we do what we do."
- "[I will] arrest when they violate ex parte."
- "[I will] create a document for future advocates explaining [Order of Protection] specifics."
- "[I will] go back and train our staff on information provided."
- "[I will] talk more to our judges, DA, and law enforcement about expectations they have and how I can help clients make the legal process easier."
- "[I will] ask about animal abuse in assessments."

The Council's designee completed the following actions during this reporting period:

- Provided technical assistance to 29 Certified and 3 uncertified Batterers' Intervention Programs.
- Responded to 234 technical assistance calls and emails from law enforcement, courts, batterers' intervention programs, victim advocates, and others.
- Disseminated 52,761 individual communications to Council members, law enforcement, courts, batterers' intervention programs, victim advocates, and others.
- Provided 5,640 communications, including technical assistance and information sharing, to Batterers' Intervention Programs on a listserv for certified programs.

**Welcome:**

General Rachel Willis called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. CST. Council members and guests introduced themselves.

**Review and Approve Minutes:**

General Willis requested that the Council review the minutes from the December 2, 2016 meeting. Mary Rose Zingale moved that the minutes be approved, and Judge Jeff Hollingsworth seconded the motion. All members were in favor and the minutes were approved.

**Executive Committee Report:**

General Willis reported that the executive committee has not met since the last Council meeting. The committee will be meeting as the nominating committee as the Council needs to elect officers at the June meeting. If any of the Council members are interested in being an officer or have a recommendation of who to nominate, please speak to someone on the committee.

**Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report:**

With permission from the committee, Bethanie Poe presented the Certification and Monitoring Review Committee Report. Four programs have submitted complete applications for recertification, and one program has submitted all the materials required for initial certification.

- Program applying for certification:

The Batters' Intervention Program at Successful Survivors has been working on their initial certification application since 2015. They recently completed all the necessary changes to their application. At the December 2016 meeting, the Certification and Monitoring Committee had additional questions regarding specific aspects of their application, and it was decided to postpone bringing this application to the Council until more information can be gathered. The

additional information has been submitted and the application is complete. Jeanne Broadwell made a motion to approve the initial certification of the Batterers' Intervention Program at Successful Survivors, which was seconded by Judge Jeff Hollingsworth. The motion was passed with Judge Angelita Blackshear Dalton abstaining.

- Programs applying for recertification:

Abuse Alternatives in Bristol submitted a complete recertification application. This program was successfully monitored in August 2016 with no corrective actions needed. Judge Angelita Blackshear Dalton made a motion to recertify, with Judge Jeff Hollingsworth seconding. The motion passed with all members in favor.

Community Probation Services in McMinnville has submitted all the material necessary for recertification and was monitored on February 24, 2017. Evelyn Gaines Guzman moved to recertify the program and Maggi Duncan seconded. The motion passed with all in favor.

Managing Emotions Nonviolently (M.E.N.) at Stepping Out Inc., in Morristown submitted all the materials necessary for recertification and was successfully monitored on February 9, 2017. Judge Angelita Blackshear Dalton moved to recertify the program and Judge Jeff Hollingsworth seconded the motion. All members were in favor and the motion passed.

Tennessee Correctional Services in Jackson and Memphis submitted a complete recertification application and was monitored on February 23, 2017. Judge Angelita Blackshear Dalton made a motion to recertify the program and Jeanne Broadwell seconded. The motion passed with all members in favor.

There were three training approval requests made since the last Council meeting. The Sheriff's Anti-Violence Effort (S.A.V.E) requested that the STOP Domestic Violence training provided by the University of Tennessee Institute for Public Service be approved for BIP hours. This training is 32 hours and occurs over four days and will have sessions in Franklin, Martin, Maryville, and Memphis. Maggi Duncan moved that the training be approved, which was seconded by Rachel Willis. The motion passed.

Abuse Alternatives requested two trainings be approved. The first was a two hour training presented by the Infant Mental Health Community Training Institute on March 14, 2016 entitled "The Impact of Family Violence on Infants and Young Children". A motion to approve the training was made by Judge Angelita Blackshear Dalton and seconded by Jeanne Broadwell. The motion passed with all members in favor.

The second training was "PRIME for Life" by the Prevention Research Institute. This was a 16 hour training held June 15-16, 2016. Mary Rose Zingale made a motion to approve the training, and the motion was seconded by Jeanne Broadwell. The motion passed.

Since the last Council meeting, four BIPs were monitored: Community Probation Services in McMinnville; Managing Emotions Nonviolently (M.E.N.) at Stepping Out Inc., in Morristown; One-Eighty in Knoxville; and Tennessee Correctional Services in Jackson. There are four programs that need to be monitored before the next Council meeting and Bethanie will be reaching out to Council members for their assistance.

### **Training Committee Report:**

Mary Rose Zingale presented the Training Committee report. Judge Dalton and Judge Snyder presented at the Tennessee General Sessions Judges Conference in February which went well.

The training committee met this morning to discuss how to better distribute the survey to assess perceived training needs for stakeholders across the state. It was decided that hard copies of the survey would be placed in the participants' packets at the upcoming judicial and clerk conferences produced by the AOC.

### **Legislative Update:**

Kathy Walsh presented the legislative update. The Coalition is working on a number of bills this legislative session including SB554/HB349 which will change the standard for when a court may terminate parental rights to a child who was conceived as the result of the parent's rape of the mother from a criminal conviction to clear and convincing evidence that the rape occurred; SB555/HB29 which deletes the provision in current law giving an alleged offender the right to have notice of and suspend all action concerning a claim for victim's compensation; and SB50/HB434 which clarifies the process when an order of protection becomes part of a divorce.

### **Other Business:**


As a follow up from the previous meeting, there was a discussion about how Orders of Protection are tracked. It was determined that records of Orders of Protection remain in NCIC for five years past the issue date. As most courts do not have NCIC access, they need to get user agreements with their local law enforcement agencies that do have NCIC access. Once the user agreement is obtained, law enforcement can run NCIC inquiries at the request of the court.



Proposed dates for the 2018 Council meetings were included in the packet. Members were encouraged to review them and let Bethanie know about any potential conflicts.


