

# **FISCAL NOTE**

## **HB 2424 - SB 2744**

March 9, 1998

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Allows local education agencies and juvenile courts to enter into agreements under which the juvenile court may operate a juvenile justice alternative education program and conditions which must be met to do so; allows the local education agencies to pay the juvenile courts to operate such programs; requires a conference between a student removed from a class, parent or guardian and principal regarding removal and order for appropriate placement of the student; requires reporting among juvenile courts, law enforcement, district attorneys general, and the school system regarding arrests of students; requires annual reporting by the school district to the Department of Education.

### **ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Increase State Expenditures - Not Significant**  
**Increase Local Govt. Expenditures - Exceed \$1,000,000/Permissive**

Assumes significant number of local education agencies and juvenile courts will enter into agreements to establish or expand a juvenile justice alternative education program. Assumes additional resources for agencies involved in notifications and reporting will be required but will not exceed \$100,000.
