

FISCAL NOTE

SB 2708 - HB 3246

February 16, 1998

SUMMARY OF BILL: Provides for the expungement of records of certain first offenses of driving under the influence laws, if:

- the violator is less than 25 years of age;
- the violation involved no property damage or personal injury;
- at least 5 years have elapsed since such violation; and
- the person has had no subsequent violations of such law.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Decrease Local Govt. Revenues - Not Significant

Local Govt. Expenditures - Net Impact / Not Significant

To the extent that any offender whose first offense record is expunged and is then convicted of a second offense within 10 years, local governments will experience a decrease in revenue and in expenditures since the offense would not be counted as a second offense and would not be subject to second offense penalties.

To the extent that local governments experience any increase in expenditures associated with record keeping and destroying of records, the impact is estimated to be not significant.
