By deleting all language after the enacting clause and by substituting instead the following:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the following segments of Interstate Highway 40 and Interstate Highway 240 in Shelby County are hereby designated as the "St. Jude Children's Research Highway": beginning at the Tennessee entrance to the Memphis-Arkansas Bridge on Interstate Highway 40 eastward to such route's intersection with Interstate Highway 240; then southward on Interstate Highway 240 to its intersection with Interstate Highway 55.

SECTION 2. The department of transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating such segments of Interstate Highway 40 and Interstate Highway 240 in Shelby County as the "St. Jude Children's Research Highway".

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the department of transportation shall erect and maintain directional signs for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital on Interstate Highway 40 at Exit 1C (Danny Thomas Boulevard), both westbound and eastbound, in Shelby County.

SECTION 4. The directional signs provided for in Section 3 shall contain the following language:

"WELCOME TO MEMPHIS

HOME OF ST. JUDE CHILDREN'S RESEARCH HOSPITAL".

SECTION 5. The erection of the signs provided for by this act shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

SECTION 6. This act shall become operative only if the federal highway administrator advises the commissioner of transportation in writing that the provisions of this act shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
