

HOUSE RESOLUTION 28

A RESOLUTION to continue the highway safety study of the Safety Subcommittee of the House Transportation Committee directed by House Resolution No. 91 of the 100th General Assembly.

WHEREAS, the safety of this state's system of highways and other routes is of paramount concern to all Tennesseans; and

WHEREAS, in response to this concern, House Resolution No. 91 of the 100th General Assembly directed the Safety Subcommittee of the House Transportation Committee to study highway safety in Tennessee and to perform a comprehensive examination of highway safety statutes and enforcement; and

WHEREAS, on February 17, 1999, the subcommittee presented a detailed report on safety issues examined during the course of its tenure; and

WHEREAS, due to the significance of highway safety and the depth of issues involved, the subcommittee has not been able to completely discharge the responsibilities before it; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, That the Safety Subcommittee of the House Transportation Committee directed to study highway safety by

House Resolution No. 91 of the 100th General Assembly is hereby directed to continue its study for a period of one (1) year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Safety Subcommittee shall timely report its findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, to the House Transportation Committee on or before February 14, 2,000.
