AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102, relative to alcoholic beverages at hotels.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102(14), is amended by adding the following new subdivision thereto:

(F)(i) "Hotel" also includes a bed and breakfast establishment as defined in § 68-14-502, where meals are regularly served to guests and where sleeping accommodations and dining facilities being conducted in the same buildings or structures used in connection therewith are on the same premises and are part of the hotel operation. In such establishment there must be six (6) rooms for sleeping accommodations and a seating capacity of twenty-five (25) people at tables. The premises upon which such establishment is located shall have a business conference center.

(ii) The provisions of this subdivision shall apply in any county having a population of not less than eight hundred thousand (800,000) according to the 1990 Federal Census or any subsequent Federal Census.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
