

CORRECTED FISCAL NOTE

HB 2498 - SB 2928

March 8, 2000

SUMMARY OF BILL: Provides that an individual whose D.U.I. conviction is more than 10 years old and who is permanently handicapped and unable to drive a motor vehicle is not subject to the provision requiring that the person's photo identification license must indicate if the holder has had their license revoked or suspended for a D.U.I. conviction. Requires such person to provide documentation required by the Department of Safety.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

On February 12, 2000 we issued a fiscal note on this bill which indicated that:

The impact of this bill is a one-time increase in state expenditures of \$5,000 for computer system changes in the Department of Safety.

Based upon new information provided by the Department of Safety, the estimated impact of this bill is:

MINIMAL

The Department of Safety indicates that due to the small number of persons affected by the provisions of the bill they believe they can manually process these license types without a computer program change.
