

FISCAL NOTE

SB 1029 - HB 1813

March 8, 1999

SUMMARY OF BILL: Deletes the provision authorizing the destruction of temporary records and working papers by the county public records commission without retaining originals of such records. Removes exemption of temporary records and working papers from the requirement that the state librarian and archivist be notified and have the opportunity to review local government records before they are destroyed.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - Not Significant

Increase Local Govt. Expenditures - Not Significant

Assumes the state would experience an increase in expenditures for administrative costs incurred by the state librarian and archivist to process referrals of proposals to destroy records which is estimated to be not significant.

Assumes local governments would experience an increase in expenditures for the costs of retaining originals of temporary records and working papers before they are destroyed as well as the costs of notifying the state librarian and archivist of the planned destruction of such records. This increase is estimated to be not significant.
