

FISCAL NOTE

SB 1468 - HB 1542

April 5, 1999

SUMMARY OF BILL:

1. removes certain offenses that are considered as qualifying offenses to be classified as a *Motor Vehicle Habitual Offender*.
2. adds the offense of aggravated vehicular homicide.
3. requires the Department of Safety to revoke the license automatically when a person meets the criteria based on qualifying offenses and give notice by certified mail. Current law requires the Department of Safety to notify the District Attorney General who must then petition the court to declare the person a Motor Vehicle Habitual Offender.
4. provides that the offender may appeal through the courts.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$18,700

Other Fiscal Impact - Cost Avoidance - \$ 85,000

Assumes additional costs for staff and postage for the Department of Safety and a cost avoidance for the District Attorneys General Conference for decrease in staff time involved in these cases.
