

FISCAL NOTE

SB 2643 - HB 2451

March 14, 2000

SUMMARY OF BILL: Exempts law enforcement agencies that have delegated the responsibility for maintaining booking records to another law enforcement agency from the requirement that they be audited for compliance with the booking procedures outlined by the Comptroller of the Treasury and the provision that authorizes the removal of the sheriff or police chief for not complying with such booking procedures. Authorizes any law enforcement agency which has been delegated the responsibility for maintaining booking records to charge the delegating agency \$1.00 per fingerprinted arrestee to offset the cost of obtaining the fingerprints.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - Less than \$100,000

Increase Local Govt. Expenditures - Less than \$100,000

Increase Local Govt. Revenues - Less than \$100,000 / Permissive

Assumes:

- the state will experience an increase in expenditures to the extent local law enforcement agencies choose to charge the \$1.00 fee authorized by this bill to state law enforcement agencies bringing arrestees to the local sheriff's office or police department.
- local law enforcement agencies delegating the responsibility for maintaining booking records that are required to pay this \$1.00 fee to the agency which has been delegated the responsibility will experience an increase in expenditures estimated to be less than \$100,000
- local law enforcement agencies choosing to charge this \$1.00 fee per fingerprinted arrestee will experience an increase in revenues estimated to be less than \$100,000 from the state and affected local governments.
