

SENATE BILL 1831

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, Chapter 4, relative to serving alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises of certain country clubs located on historic properties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-101, is amended by adding the following as a new, appropriately designated subsection:

() It is lawful to serve wine and other alcoholic beverages as defined in § 57-4-102, to be consumed on the premises of any country club located on an historic property, as herein defined, to the patrons and guests of such country club, subject to the further provisions of this chapter other than § 57-4-103.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102, is amended by adding the following new, appropriately designated subdivision:

() "Country club located on an historic property " means a country club that is located in a county having a population of not less than forty-four thousand five hundred (44,500) nor more than forty-five thousand (45,000) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, and has the following characteristics:

(A) Sits on real property that was formerly the home of the International Printing Pressmen Union;

(B) Has a dining facility; and

(C) Is located adjacent to an eighteen (18) hole golf course.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001, the public welfare requiring it.
