

FISCAL NOTE

HB 1985 - SB 1958

February 1, 2002

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires the Department of Safety to transmit, in electronic format, necessary information contained on applications for intermediate driver licenses, driver licenses, renewals, or photo identification licenses to the federal selective service system for any male U.S. citizen or immigrant who is at least 18 years of age but less than 26 and is required to be registered. Specifies that the Department is not required to submit the information until it has a sufficient computer operating system in place to effectuate such transmission. Requires applications to contain language indicating that the person submitting the application consents to registration with the Selective Service System if required by Federal law.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$58,820 One-Time

Estimate assumes:

- the Department of Safety will be required to replace driver license applications currently in use to comply with the requirements of the bill. The cost of this replacement is estimated to be \$48,820.
- \$10,000 for computer system changes.

NOTE: According to the Department of Safety, driver license applications are ordered annually and have already been ordered for this year. There would be no additional cost to change the applications if the effective date of the act were after July 1, 2003.
