

# **FISCAL NOTE**

## **SB 410 - HB 1102**

February 7, 2001

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Replaces current provision which specifies that it is an offense to possess a firearm on the premises of any establishment where alcoholic beverages are served or in the confines of any building where alcoholic beverages are sold with a provision specifying that it is an offense to possess a firearm on the premises or in the confines of a building of an establishment open to the public where alcoholic beverages are served as the sole or primary product of such establishment. Provides that law enforcement officers are not subject to this provision rather than just law enforcement officers in the actual discharge of official duties as under current law.

### **ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Decrease Local Govt. Expenditures - Not Significant**  
**Decrease Local Govt. Revenues - Not Significant**

Estimate assumes fewer convictions for unlawfully possessing a handgun. Impact depends upon the reduction in the number of persons convicted of this offense and the resulting decreased cost to local governments to confine such persons versus the decreased revenues to local governments from fines not levied or collected that would have been in the absence of the bill.
