

FISCAL NOTE

SB 1488 - HB 1028

February 20, 2001

SUMMARY OF BILL: Specifies that a person younger than 21 years of age convicted of the purchase, attempt to purchase or possession of alcoholic beverages, or making a false statement or exhibition of false identification for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining alcoholic beverages is subject to the suspension of their driving privileges and order the court where such person was convicted to send an order denying such privileges to the Department of Safety within 5 working days of such conviction.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

MINIMAL

Estimate assumes no additional driver license suspensions. Current law already provides for the suspension of driving privileges for those under 21 purchasing or obtaining alcoholic beverages in violation of T.C.A. 57-4-203 which includes provisions regarding use of false identification.
