

FISCAL NOTE

SB 2187 - HB 2513

February 7, 2002

SUMMARY OF BILL: Specifies that the first \$500 of the fine imposed for patronizing prostitution or promoting prostitution shall be transmitted to the sheriff's department of the county in which the offense was committed if there is established in such county a program for the rehabilitation and treatment of persons convicted of engaging in prostitution. Specifies that the clerk collecting such fine and transmitting it to the sheriff is entitled to retain \$10 to defray administrative costs.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Other Fiscal Impact - Shifts local government revenues estimated to be less than \$100,000 statewide from county general funds to county sheriff departments.

Estimate assumes to the extent a county has a program in place to rehabilitate those convicted of prostitution they will experience a shift in revenues from the general fund of the county to the sheriff's department. This shift is estimated to be less than \$100,000 statewide.
