

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 728

A RESOLUTION to propose an amendment to Article II of the
Constitution of the State of Tennessee, relative
to residency of legislators.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED
FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING, that a majority of all the members of each house concurring, as shown by the
yeas and nays entered on their journals, that it is proposed that the Constitution of Tennessee
be amended as follows:

That Article II, Section 9 be amended by deleting the language "resident in the
county" and by substituting instead the following language:

resident in the district

That Article II, Section 10 be amended by deleting the language "one year in the
county or district" and by substituting instead the following language:

one year in the district

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the foregoing be referred to the One Hundred Fifth
General Assembly and that this resolution proposing such amendment be published by the
Secretary of State in accordance with Article XI, Section 3 of the Constitution of the State of
Tennessee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Senate is directed to deliver a copy
of this resolution to the Secretary of State.
