

FISCAL NOTE

HB 2923 - SB 3143

March 8, 2006

SUMMARY OF BILL: Encourages LEAs that have expanded existing or implemented new physical activity programs to report annually to the Department of Education on such programs. If the LEA has completed a BMI-for-age assessment on its students, the effectiveness of the physical education programs can be evaluated using the assessment results so that model physical activity programs can be developed by the department for adoption by other LEAs. LEAs are required to review and report on the effect of structured and intramural sports on the long-term health of students.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase Local Govt. Expenditures – Not Significant/Permissive

Assumptions:

- Since the bill encourages, but does not require, LEAs to submit an annual report on physical activity programs and the effect of structured and intramural sports, the cost to local governments is estimated to be not significant.
- Those LEAs that choose to submit such a report could encounter a cost associated with compiling and submitting the information; however, any cost to such LEAs is estimated to be not significant and can be handled within existing budgeted resources.
