

FISCAL NOTE

HB 3193 - SB 3507

March 19, 2006

SUMMARY OF BILL: Permits a voter who is unable to present proper evidence of identification to vote a provisional ballot. Such voters would only be authorized to use forms of identification that include a photograph of the voter. If the voter does not have and is unable to afford a valid photo identification license, such identification would be issued to the voter upon the voter's signing of a pauper's oath and any fees would be waived.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

**Increase State Expenditures – \$51,850 One-Time
Foregone State Revenues - \$332,500**

Assumptions:

- A one-time printing cost for affidavit of indigence and photo only ID licenses (50,000 forms @ \$.05 each = \$2,500; 35,000 @ \$1.41 photo cost = \$49,350).
- Foregone revenues of an estimated \$322,500 for certain photo only identification licenses issued by the Department of Safety at not cost to the applicant. Assumes approximately 35,000 would ask for a free ID. The usual fee for a 5-year photo identification license is \$9.50. (35,000 x \$9.50 = \$322,500).
