

# **FISCAL NOTE**

## **SB 100**

January 27, 2005

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Establishes a new license for “mortuary services.” Requires licensee to have not less than one million dollars in liability insurance.

### **ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**State Revenues – Net Impact – Not Significant**  
**Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant**

Assumptions:

- Businesses currently performing what this bill defines as “mortuary services” must obtain licensure as a funeral establishment. If this bill becomes law, it is assumed that such businesses would no longer obtain licensure as a funeral establishment but instead would obtain a mortuary services license.
- The license fee for mortuary services would be less than the license fee for funeral establishments. Any decrease in state revenues as a result of a business obtaining a mortuary services license instead of funeral establishment license will not be significant.
- Any decrease in state revenues from license fees to the extent that currently licensed funeral establishments will not be able to meet the requirements of this bill will not be significant.
- Any increase in state revenues from the collection of license fees as a result of new businesses becoming licensed under the provisions of this bill will not be significant.
- Any increase in state expenditures to implement and monitor the provisions of this bill will not be significant.
