

FISCAL NOTE

SB 3769 - HB 3733

March 27, 2006

SUMMARY OF BILL: Provides for the immediate confiscation of the driver's license of any person arrested for the offense of DUI who registers at least .08 blood alcohol content or refuses to submit to a blood/alcohol test. Such driver will be issued a 100-day driving permit and will be allowed to pursue a due process administrative review hearing.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Assumptions:

- Approximately 55,000 drivers will have their driver license revoked on an annual basis.
- An increase in state revenues from the collection of various fees. Due to the implementation dates of the bill and the timing of suspensions, the state will not begin to receive the full amount of fees until the fourth fiscal year.
- An increase in state expenditures to fund the salary, benefits and operational expenses for seventy-four positions to implement and execute the provisions of this bill and to hold administrative review hearings when fully operational.
- An increase in local government revenues from reimbursements paid by the Department of Safety for local officers to appear at administrative review hearings.
- An increase in local government expenditures to appear at administrative review hearings.

- In order to implement the provisions of this bill, there will be an increase in state expenditures beginning January 2007. License revocation and the collection of associated fees will not begin to take place until January 2008.
