

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 572

A RESOLUTION to honor and commend Carl Dew for his fifty-seven years of outstanding service as a pharmacist.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should salute those citizens who, through their extraordinary efforts, have dedicated themselves to their professions and of whom we can all be proud; and

WHEREAS, one such noteworthy person is Carl Dew of Lake City who, since 1940, has been continuously licensed as a pharmacist by the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, in his long and illustrious career, Mr. Dew has garnered numerous awards and special recognitions; and

WHEREAS, in 1963, Carl Dew was awarded the Bowl of Hygeia, a national award which recognized his dedication to community service; and

WHEREAS, a leader among his peers, he stood as the President of the Tennessee Pharmacists Association in 1973 and was chosen as the Pharmacist of the Year in Tennessee in 1979; and

WHEREAS, at the age of ninety, Mr. Dew was recognized in *Drug Topics*, the pharmacist's national publication, on behalf of his fifty-seven years of service to his profession, a level of service which is perhaps unmatched in the United States; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his dedication to his career, Carl Dew has remained active within his community and his church, offering his time and energies to many volunteer activities; and

WHEREAS, this General Assembly finds it appropriate to pause in its deliberations to acknowledge and applaud Carl Dew for his dedication to his profession and to the State of Tennessee and its citizens; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we hereby honor and commend Carl Dew for his fifty-seven years of continuous service as one of the outstanding pharmacists in the State of Tennessee, express our gratitude for his significant contributions to his community, and extend to him our best wishes for every future success and happiness.
