



licensure applications and additional investigations that may occur. This increase is estimated to be not significant.

- The Board of Medical Examiners will operate the data collection system for both boards. The Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners will not incur a significant increase in expenditures to forward collected data to the Board of Medical Examiners.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 4-3-1011 and 63-1-137, all health-related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period.
- As of June 30, 2007, the Board of Medical Examiners was operating under a cumulative budget surplus of \$1,044,107. The Board will be able to incur the additional expenses within its current revenue collections.
- As of June 30, 2007, the Board of Osteopathic Examiners was operating under a cumulative budget deficit of \$65,679, yet has operated within its revenue collections for the past two fiscal years (FY05-06 and FY06-07). The Board may have to increase fees to cover the increase in expenditures. Such is estimated to be not significant.
