

**CORRECTED FISCAL MEMORANDUM  
SB 2594 – HB 2585**

April 29, 2008

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (016415):** Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Requires sex offenders to provide Internet account information such as e-mail address, user names and aliases on the sex offender registry, and to notify their registering agency within three days, excluding holidays, of any changes to such information. Authorizes the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) to transmit such information electronically to companies that provide pre-screening services.

**CORRECTED FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:**

Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:**

On April 21, 2008, we issued a fiscal memorandum on this amendment indicating *a one-time increase in state expenditures of \$18,000 and a not significant increase in local expenditures*. Based on additional information provided to us, the fiscal impact of the bill with the proposed amendment is as follows:

**Unchanged from the original fiscal note.**

Assumptions applied to amendment:

- The TBI would need to revise the Registration Form to include the additional information regarding the sex offenders' Internet account information. Any cost associated with revising the registration form and transmitting such information electronically is estimated to be not significant and could be handled within existing resources of the TBI without an increased appropriation.
- Any additional cost for the registering agencies to be notified by the sex offender of changes to such information is estimated to be not significant and could be handled within existing resources.

- According to the Board of Probation and Parole (BOPP), most sex offenders under supervision are not allowed to use computers or the Internet, and such offenders must sign a “Specialized Probation Conditions for Sex Offenders” form to that effect.
- No requirement for BOPP officers to monitor this type of information or computer usage by registered offenders. Once an officer notifies the TBI of any changes to an offender’s Internet account information, the bill does not require any follow-up by the Board.
