

**FISCAL MEMORANDUM**  
**HB 3937 – SB 4030**

April 21, 2008

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (015370):** Deletes all language of the original bill and requires the fingerprint cards of juvenile arrestees be delivered to the juvenile court for transmittal to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) or in tandem with the R-84 Disposition Cards in certain circumstances. Authorizes the release of records for employment or licensing purposes pertaining to a juvenile who has been adjudicated delinquent for certain offenses. Requires the juvenile court to inform the juvenile of the potential release of records. Revises law enforcement agency requirements to destroy juvenile records.

**FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:**

Decrease State Expenditures - \$3,300

Decrease Local Expenditures - \$1,800

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:**

**Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant**

**Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant**

Assumptions applied to amendment:

- Any cost incurred by TBI associated with training of TBI staff and staff of submitting agencies will not be significant and can be accommodated within existing resources without an increased appropriation or reduced reversion.
- Any costs incurred by the state and local courts can be absorbed within existing judicial resources.
- There will not be a significant fiscal impact to local law enforcement agencies for the revision to juvenile record requirements.
