

FISCAL NOTE

HB 392 – SB 1179

March 10, 2007

SUMMARY OF BILL: Reduces from 9 to 7.5 grams the amount of ephedrine or pseudoephedrine contained in a product that can be sold to the same person in a 30-day period. Offense is a Class A misdemeanor punishable by fine only.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Revenues – Not Significant
Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Govt. Revenues – Not Significant
Increase Local Govt. Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- This bill could result in more complaints against licensed pharmacies and pharmacists. Such complaints would result in increased expenditures for the Board of Pharmacy for investigations and could generate some additional revenues in civil penalties. However, the total amount of expenditures and revenues is expected to be minimal.
- There will not be a sufficient additional number of prosecutions for local governments to experience any significant increase in revenues or expenses.
