

# FISCAL NOTE

## HB 2606 - SB 2896

January 22, 2008

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Requires funeral directors to disclose to the purchaser of a funeral service that it is a violation of state law for a funeral establishment to refuse to surrender the custody of a dead human body to the person legally entitled to custody. Removes a licensee's exemption from continuing education requirements if disciplinary action is taken against the licensee by the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers

### ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

**Increase State Revenue – Not Significant**

**Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-3-1011, all regulatory boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period.
- Any costs to implement and enforce the provisions of this bill will be not significant and will be offset by a corresponding increase in revenue.
