AN ACT to name a road in Bedford County in honor of Helen J. Brown.

WHEREAS, Helen J. Brown has served the citizens of Tennessee since 1969 at the Tennessee Fire School at Old Fort Parkway in Murfreesboro; and

WHEREAS, Helen J. Brown served at the Tennessee Fire School until it closed in 2001; and

WHEREAS, she served as the liaison between firefighters and instructors for many years; and

WHEREAS, not only does she organize classes in Tennessee, Helen J. Brown helped tremendously with "Tennessee Week-end" held at the National Fire Academy in Emmittsburg, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, due to her tireless efforts, many of Tennessee's firefighters are well trained and ready to save lives; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting to recognize her exemplary service of thirty-two (32) years to the citizens of Tennessee; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the road between the Tennessee Fire Service Codes and Enforcement Academy Administration Building and the Tennessee Fire Service Codes and Enforcement Fire Station is hereby designated as the "Helen J. Brown Boulevard" in recognition of the outstanding dedication of this industrious public servant.

SECTION 2. The Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating the road described in Section 1 as the "Helen J. Brown Boulevard".

SECTION 3. The erection of such signs shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices*.

SECTION 4. This act shall become operative only if the federal highway administrator advises the Commissioner of Transportation in writing that the provisions

of this act shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.

SECTION 5. This act shall become operative only if the cost of the manufacture and installation of such signs is paid to the Department of Transportation by Bedford County within one (1) year of the effective date of this act. Such payment shall be made prior to any expenditure by the state for the manufacture or installation of such signs. The department shall return any unused portion of the estimated cost to Bedford County within thirty (30) days of the erection of such signs. If the actual cost exceeds the estimated cost, an amount equal to the difference in such costs shall be remitted to the department by Bedford County within thirty (30) days of the county receiving an itemized invoice of the actual cost from the department.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
