FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 107 – SB 393

April 16, 2009

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (004895, 005791): Amendment 004895 expands the proposed offense of texting while driving to include such offenses committed on any public road in addition to offenses committed on highways; adds provision to original bill stating that the motor vehicle must be in motion to constitute a violation. Amendment 005791 exempts certain law enforcement personnel and emergency management personnel from the offense of texting while driving.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Revenue - \$41,600/Recurring

Increase State Expenditures - \$21,000/One-Time

Increase Local Revenue - \$2,200/Recurring

Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumption applied to amendment:

- Based on responses received from the Departments of Safety and Transportation, the fiscal impact for this bill as amended is unchanged from the impact estimated for the original bill.
