FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 670 – SB 1141

May 24, 2010

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS (018939, 018959): Amendment 018939 deletes all language following the enacting clause. Requires the Tennessee Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Commission to develop a written procedure for verifying citizenship of people arrested, booked, or confined in a county or municipal jail or detention facilities. Requires the keeper of a jail to use the POST procedure for verification of citizenship of persons arrested and report violators of the Immigration and Naturalization Act to the appropriate Federal officials. Exempts counties or municipalities that have a memorandum of understanding with the United States Department of Homeland Security. Amendment 018959 deletes “appropriate federal officials” where it appears in amendment 018939 and replaces it with “appropriate Immigration and Customs Enforcement Detention and Removal Operations field office.”


Assumptions applied to amendments:

- This bill does not require immigration status verification through the SAVE system.
- According to the POST Commission, these procedures can be developed during regular business meetings and will not result in a significant increase in state expenditures.
- Local governments will notify the Department of Homeland Security via internet, phone, fax, or other low cost method.

- Any increase in local government expenditures to adhere to the procedures developed by the POST Commission and for notification of the Department of Homeland Security of prisoners of questionable citizenship status is estimated to be not significant.
