HB 282 – SB 300

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires, instead of permits, motor vehicle officers investigating accidents to have the parties exchange insurance information.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- In approximately seven weeks, the Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP) will begin capturing this information on new crash report forms. Any increase in state expenditures for requiring the parties to exchange insurance information is expected to be not significant.
- Local law enforcement agencies are already responding to accidents. Any increase in local expenditures for requiring parties to exchange insurance information is expected to be not significant.
