**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 472 - SB 1439**

February 20, 2009

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Requires the Board for Licensing Alarm System Contractors to conduct hearings when there are allegations of misconduct with regards to denial of licensure or registration by an applicant.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Increase State Revenue - \$33,000/Board for Licensing Alarm System Contractors**  
**Increase State Expenditures - \$33,000/Board for Licensing Alarm System Contractors**

Assumptions:

- According to the Board, approximately 100 applications are denied annually for misconduct.
- The Board predicts a minimum of two hearings per month. Cost of each hearing is \$1,372.20 (\$600 for general expense plus mileage costs of \$772.20 (\$154.44 travel x 5 members)).
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-3-011, all regulatory boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. As of June 30, 2008, the Board had a positive balance of \$49,831.32. According to the Board, fees will be increased to cover costs.
