FISCAL NOTE

HB 2518 – SB 2622

January 22, 2010

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation to include violent juvenile sexual offender profiles in its centralized DNA system. Requires a person who commits or attempts to commit the act of aggravated rape of a child to provide a specimen for DNA analysis. Defines “violent juvenile sexual offender” as any person adjudicated delinquent for any act that if committed by an adult would be considered aggravated rape, rape, aggravated sexual battery, sexual battery, rape of a child, aggravated rape of a child and incest.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Revenue - Not Significant

Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) currently maintains a DNA database for sexual offenders.
- There will be no significant increase to local law enforcement or health departments to take biological specimen or samples.
- According to the TBI, the number of juvenile offenders included in this bill would be small enough to be managed by current agency staff requiring no additional administrative funds.
