FISCAL NOTE

HB 3194 - SB 3448

February 4, 2010

SUMMARY OF BILL: Exempts non-Tennessee residents from paying the \$60 marriage license fee when obtaining such license in Campbell County.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Decrease State Revenue - \$7,600/Earmarked as follows:

Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) -	\$882
Department of Children's Services (DCS) -	\$1,890
Office of Criminal Justice -	\$945
Tennessee Disability Coalition -	\$2,583
Tennessee CASA -	\$378
Department of Education -	\$504
National Assoc. of Social Workers -	\$378

Assumptions:

- In 2009, Campbell County issued 126 marriage licenses to out-of-state couples who paid the \$60 licensing fee.
- The decrease in fee collections will result in a decrease in state revenue of \$7,560 (\$60 x 126).
- The \$60 marriage license fee is earmarked as follows:
 - Seven dollars to AOC to fund parenting plan requirements resulting in a decrease of \$882 (\$7 x 126);
 - Fifteen dollars to DCS for child abuse prevention services resulting in a decrease of \$1,890 (\$15 x 126);
 - Seven dollars and fifty cents to the Office of Criminal Justice programs for domestic violence services resulting in a decrease of \$945 (\$7.50 x 126);
 - Twenty dollars and fifty cents to the Tennessee Disability Coalition for services to families and children resulting in a decrease of \$2,583 (\$20.50 x 126);
 - Three dollars to the Tennessee Court Appointed Special Advocates Association (CASA) resulting in a decrease of \$378 (\$3 x 126);
 - Four dollars to the Department of Education for grants to the Tennessee Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs resulting in a decrease of \$504 (\$4 x 126);
 - Three dollars to the Tennessee Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers to strengthen services and referral networks to families and children resulting in a decrease of \$378 (\$3 x 126).

- There will be no impact on the \$2.50 marriage license fee earmarked for the county clerks.
