**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 3384 - SB 3383**

February 16, 2010

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Authorizes the legislative body of any municipality or county to adopt an ordinance or resolution which grants the law director petition powers for the disposition of dogs which cause death or serious injury to other animals or humans.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant**

**Decrease Local Expenditures – Not Significant/Permissive**

Assumptions:

- According to the District Attorneys General Conference, any impact to the District Attorneys is estimated to be not significant.
- Local governments who choose to adopt a resolution may experience a decrease in expenditures as a result of holding dogs for a shorter period of time before euthanizing. Any decrease in local expenditures is estimated to be not significant.
