FISCAL NOTE

HJR 767

SUMMARY OF BILL: Directs the Department of Education (DOE) to study the benefits of utilizing a green cleaning program in Tennessee, including its effect on teacher and student attendance and test scores. Requires DOE to examine the green cleaning programs at Eagleton Elementary and Carpenters Middle Schools in Blount County. DOE shall make a report to the Education, Environment and Conservation, and Health Committees of the General Assembly no later than February 1, 2011.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- According to DOE, they will seek assistance from the Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) since DOE does not have the expertise or needed personnel to study and make the report. Blount County Schools will provide assistance as needed. Any increase in state or local expenditures is estimated to be not significant.
- Without assistance from TDEC, DOE would have to hire or contract with additional personnel to complete the study.
