FISCAL NOTE

SB 2778 - HB 3246

February 26, 2010

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires any person who requires emergency assistance from the Division of Parks and Recreation or Division employees while on state park grounds to reimburse the Division for any cost associated with such assistance. The Commissioner of the Department of Environment and Conservation is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Revenue – Not Significant

Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- According to the Department of Environment and Conservation, most emergency responses handled currently require no additional expenditure.
- Any increase to state revenue from reimbursements will be not significant.
- There will be a not significant increase to state expenditures resulting from the issuance of bills to park guests who require emergency assistance.
