FISCAL NOTE

SB 3025 - HB 3220

February 9, 2010

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes the use of all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) on designated highways with certain restrictions, including requiring headlights and taillights. Violation is a Class C misdemeanor. Authorizes local government legislative bodies to regulate operation of ATVs; authorizes local governments to charge a \$25 annual fee to drivers who use ATVs on highways.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Revenue – Not Significant
Increase State Expenditures – Not Significant

Increase Local Revenue – Not Significant
Increase Local Expenditures – Not Significant

Assumptions:

- Local governments who choose to allow ATVs on designated highways may experience a not significant increase in revenue from charging the \$25 fee.
- Local governments may experience a not significant increase in expenditures for implementing the ordinance.
- There will not be a sufficient number of prosecutions for state or local government to experience any significant increase in revenue or expenditures.
