Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, adds Cocke County to those counties where distilleries may be located without conducting an additional referendum if within the boundaries of the county both retail package sales and liquor-by-the-drink have been approved through voter referendum. - Amends TCA Section 57-2-103.
- 3. *SB 2258 by *McNally (HB 2396 by *Sargent)**
Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, makes the authorization for the state funding board to sell bonds at private sale permanent; currently, authorization is scheduled to expire June 30, 2012. - Amends TCA Section 9-9-205.

- 1. *SB 0177 by *Watson** (HB 0647 by *Cobb , Rich, Shipley)
Lobbying, Lobbyists - As introduced, repeals provision prohibiting persons registered as lobbyists from serving as members on certain state boards, commissions, committees and councils. - Amends TCA Section 50-6-121; Section 57-1-102; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 64.
- 2. SB 0500 by *Burks** (*HB 0479 by *Curtiss)
Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, authorizes a water utility district in the eastern portion of White County with over 1,000 customers to change the manner in which vacancies are filled and commissioners are selected. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 82.
- 3. *SB 0830 by *Summerville** (HB 1295 by *Hensley)
Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, requires commissioners of certain water utility districts in Lawrence County to be elected by the customers of the utility district. - Amends TCA Section 7-82-307.
- 4. SB 1868 by *Kyle** (*HB 1242 by *Haynes)
State Government - As introduced, requires state departments, agencies and entities to reduce paper and paper products annually by 5 percent starting on July 1, 2012. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 1, Part 4.

5. ***SB 2121 by *Kyle** (HB 2186 by *Gilmore)
Business and Commerce - As introduced, repeals Chapter _ of the Public Acts of 2011 (Senate Bill 632 / House Bill 600). - Repeals Chapter ___ of the Public Acts of 2011.

6. ***SB 2197 by *Tracy** (HB 2336 by *Keisling)
Comptroller, State - As introduced, changes references from "county audit division" to "comptroller of the treasury" and "department of audit" in provisions regarding judicial information system advisory committee members; the county financial management system; and audits of the solid waste authority. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 16 and Title 68.

7. ***SB 2265 by *Watson** (HB 2422 by *Harrison)
Local Government, General - As introduced, extends from June 30, 2012, to June 30, 2014, the expiration date for the authority of Hamilton, Knox and Shelby counties, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Memphis and Metropolitan Nashville to sell bonds at private sale upon terms and conditions that it determines and upon approval by the governing body of the local government. - Amends TCA Section 9-21-132.

8. **SB 1194 by *Yager** (*HB 1269 by *Hurley)
Industrial Development - As introduced, increases from 30 to 50 years the maximum period of time that an economic impact plan can provide for allocating property taxes to a county industrial development corporation. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 53, Part 3.

9. **SB 1716 by *Yager, Ketron** (*HB 1075 by *Maggart, McCormick, Ramsey)
County Government - As introduced, authorizes creation of design review commissions by county legislative bodies. - Amends TCA Title 5, Chapter 1, Part 1.

10. **SB 1792 by *Yager, Johnson** (*HB 0736 by *Casada, Sanderson)
Wine & Wineries - As introduced, authorizes Tennessee licensed wineries to conduct business at no more than two additional satellite locations after obtaining a satellite permit and paying a fee to the alcoholic beverage commission. - Amends TCA Title 57.

11. **SB 1952 by *Haynes** (*HB 1740 by *Sontany, Jones S, Parkinson)
Municipal Government - As introduced, makes a lien filed by a municipality for the cost of maintaining real property that is not being maintained the same priority of lien as a lien for property taxes. - Amends TCA Title 6, Chapter 54, Part 1.

12. **SB 2159 by *Ketron** (*HB 2189 by *Womick)
Naming and Designating - As introduced, names Murfreesboro National Guard Armory in honor of the late First Lieutenant William Eric Emmert. -

13. *SB 2167 by *Finney L

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, requires alcoholic beverage commission to promulgate rules and regulations restricting sale of high alcohol content beverages. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 1; Title 57, Chapter 3; Title 57, Chapter 4 and Title 57, Chapter 5.

14. SB 2170 by *Yager (*HB 2225 by *Haynes)

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, revises provisions governing the filling of vacancies occurring on the board of commissioners of certain multi-county utility districts. - Amends TCA Section 7-82-307 and Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 6.

15. SB 2175 by *Johnson (*HB 2231 by *McManus)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, enacts the "Uniformity in Tax Increment Financing Act of 2012." - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 9 and Title 13.

16. *SB 2255 by *Ketron (HB 2393 by *Johnson C)

Public Contracts - As introduced, requires the chief procurement officer to develop a transition plan by "April 1, 2012", instead of "October 1, 2011", and corrects various typographical errors in provisions governing the procurement office and the authorized entity to promulgate rules with regard to state contracting with illegal immigrants. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 56, Part 1 and Title 12, Chapter 4.

17. *SB 2290 by *Faulk (HB 2426 by *Watson)

Equalization Board - As introduced, authorizes board to approve a continuing education program for registered taxpayer agents and to charge agents a per-credit hour fee of up to \$25.00 to defray cost of program. - Amends TCA Section 67-5-1514.

18. *SB 2291 by *Faulk (HB 2427 by *Alexander)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, clarifies that provisions governing purchases by one local government under same terms as another local government's purchasing agreement apply to purchases of goods and equipment. - Amends TCA Section 12-3-1004.
