FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 2774 – SB 2780

February 22, 2012

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (013316): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Beginning July 1, 2012, increases, from \$50 to \$350, the fee paid by a defendant petitioning a court for expunction of records following successful completion of a diversion program. Specifies that the \$350 fee is not applicable in any case where there has been an acquittal, nolle prosequi or dismissal for failure to prosecute, or where by law the expunction order is not required to be sent to the TBI. Expands the purposes for which the diversion fee may be used by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI). Requires a defendant, upon request for a diversion program, to pay a \$100 fee to the court clerk to be used by TBI for stated purposes.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Revenue - \$4,431,500/TBI
Increase State Expenditures - \$4,431,500/TBI

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions applied to amendment:

- All revenue collected from the \$100 diversion request fee and the \$350 expunction fee for individuals completing a diversion program shall be used by the TBI for the following purposes: to employ personnel; purchase equipment and supplies; fund education, training and development of Bureau employees; maintain the databases; computer system support; maintenance costs; and any other purpose that allows the Bureau to do its business in a more efficient manner.
- According to TBI, there are 8,105 expungement requests and 20,000 diversion requests each year. There will be a recurring increase in state revenue of \$2,431,500 ($\$300 \times 8,105$ expungement requests) + \$2,000,000 ($\$100 \times 20,000$ diversion requests).
- The Bureau will spend the additional revenue for the stipulated purposes resulting in an increase in state expenditures of \$4,431,500 ($\$2,431,500 + \$2,000,000$).
