FISCAL NOTE

HB 2124 - SB 2075

March 27, 2011

SUMMARY OF BILL: Designates the Tennessee National Guard Armory located at 1202 East Carroll Street in Tullahoma, Coffee County, as the “*Command Sergeant Major Howard Boswell National Guard Armory*.” Directs the Department of Military to erect suitable signs or affix suitable markers. Designating signs shall be erected only if the cost of the manufacture and installation of such signs is paid to the Department from non-state funds within one year of the effective date of this act.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Other Fiscal Impact – The one-time cost of \$4,000 to manufacture and erect appropriate signage will be paid for by private funds. There will be no fiscal impact to state or local government.

Assumptions:

- The Department of Military assumes the words “National Guard Armory” are already in place on the building. Presuming “Command Sergeant Major” is abbreviated to “CSM,” the cost for the 16 remaining letters would be a total of \$4,000 (\$250 x 16 letters).
- No cost to state or local government as the one-time cost will be paid by private funds.
