SB 256 – HB 1098

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) to conduct background investigations of an appointee to a position of trust when requested by the Speaker of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

On March 21, 2011, a fiscal note was issued estimating a fiscal impact as follows: *Not Significant*. The fiscal impact remains unchanged from the original fiscal note. The assumptions have been revised to further explain the fiscal impact.

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Corrected Assumptions:

- Under current law, the Governor and Chief Justice are authorized to make requests for background investigations of appointees.
- According to the TBI, there were 37 requests from the Governor and zero from the Chief Justice in 2010.
- Six retired TBI agents are paid an hourly rate on 120-day contracts to conduct background checks requested by the Governor or Chief Justice.
- According to the TBI, background checks requested by the Speaker of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives will be conducted through the Tennessee Open Records Information Services (TORIS). The cost to provide one background check under TORIS is \$48.
- There are no data on which to base an estimate for the number of background checks the Speaker of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives will request.
- It is estimated that at least one background check will be requested per year resulting in a recurring increase in state expenditures of \$48.
