**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 677 - HB 919**

March 25, 2011

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Removes the current provision requiring the cost of highway signs designating memorial highways for state law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty to be paid from the Highway Fund, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Tenn. Code Ann. § 54-1-133 requires the Department of Transportation to fund, from the Highway Fund, the cost of signage designating a memorial highway for law enforcement officials killed in the line of duty.
- According to the Department of Transportation, removal of the provision cited in the bill will have no fiscal impact on departmental revenue or expenditures.
- Removal of this provision authorizing payment of memorial signs for law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty, in light of the remaining funding authority, will not eliminate the funding source for such signs and will not have a fiscal impact.
