**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 2590 - HB 2823**

January 29, 2012

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Grants immunity from prosecution to a person who is suspected or charged with prostitution if the alleged violation occurred while the person was a victim of involuntary labor services, a victim of trafficking for sexual servitude, or a victim as defined under the federal Trafficking Victims Protection Act.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Under current law, prostitution is a Class A or B misdemeanor.
- Granting immunity may result in a small decrease in the number of cases in the court system. Any reduction in cases will result in fewer state and local government expenditures for processing the cases and reduced state and local government revenue from fees, taxes, and costs collected. This decrease in expenditures and revenue is estimated to be not significant.
