FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 714 – HB 1282

March 21, 2013

**SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL:** Decreases, from 10 to 3 years, the amount of time a person must wait after exiting a drug or alcohol rehabilitation program or hospital before being eligible for a handgun carry permit, provided the person entered the program or hospital voluntarily. Requires a 10-year period for those who enter rehabilitation involuntarily.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (005198):** Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Decreases, from 10 to 3 years, the amount of time a person must wait after exiting a voluntary drug or alcohol rehabilitation program or hospital before being eligible for a handgun carry permit.

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:**

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- Any initial increase in handgun carry permit applications will be not significant.
