FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 1140 – HB 1287

April 8, 2013

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Increases, to at least 48 x 36 inches, the size of the notice a metal recycling facility is required to post identifying the items requiring written consent prior to the facility accepting such items.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006337): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Removes statute which currently requires any theater, in which two or more motion pictures are shown in the same building, to maintain adequate supervision to prevent minors, under the age of 18 years and lacking a parent or adult guardian, from purchasing a G-rated or PG-rated film and subsequently viewing a motion picture which is R-rated. Prohibits any minor from being admitted to a movie theater for a movie showing which has been found to be “harmful to minors” pursuant Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-17-901.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- This will have no significant fiscal impact on state or local government.
