FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 1704 – SB 2242

March 11, 2014

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Broadens the definition of “sexual offender” under Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-39-202 for purposes of the sexual offender registry to include third or subsequent convictions for observation without consent under Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-607 or any combination of three or more convictions of observation without consent and indecent exposure.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (011455): Removes registry for any combination of three or more convictions of observation without consent and indecent exposure.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- According to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, the proposed legislation will not significantly impact the State.
- The proposed legislation does not enhance the penalty for any criminal offense or create a new offense. The proposed legislation will not significantly impact the caseloads of the courts, district attorneys, or public defenders.
