FISCAL NOTE

HB 1239 - SB 1308

March 16, 2013

SUMMARY OF BILL: Creates the "Constitutional Enforcement Restraint Act of 2013". Declares that any federal law, purporting to give federal agents or federal employees the authority of a county sheriff or any other local law enforcement agency of the state, to be considered invalid. Declares that any federal law, purporting to require a local or state law enforcement agency to act at the direction of the federal government, or the United States military, to be: beyond the authority granted to the federal government pursuant to the United States Constitution; unrecognized by this state; be specifically rejected by this state; and be considered invalid by this state.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Assumptions:

- According to the Office of the Attorney General, this bill will not result in any significant fiscal impact to the Agency.
