FISCAL NOTE

SB 257 - HB 1019

February 12, 2013

SUMMARY OF BILL: Revises current statute regarding the withholding of resuscitative services. Replaces “universal do no resuscitate order” with “POST” or “physician orders for scope of treatment.” Authorizes nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists to issue a POST. Authorizes the Board for Licensing Health Care Facilities to approve forms of declaration regarding living wills. Removes the requirement a warning statement be required in any appointment of agent, or person making a health care decision for another, as long as such agent complies with the *Tennessee Health Care Decisions Act*.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- According to the Department of Health, any rulemaking or additional responsibility required by this act will have no significant fiscal impact on the Board of Licensing Health Care Facilities.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-3-1011, all health-related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board for Licensing Health Care Facilities had closing balances of \$594,769 in FY10-11 and \$450,785 in FY11-12. All the Board’s funds revert to the General Fund at the end of the year.
