FISCAL NOTE

SB 878 - HB 1020

February 20, 2013

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) to deny the purchase of a firearm to an individual if the TBI has reason to believe the purchaser is in violation of certain requirements, or the purchaser has had a license suspended or revoked that was issued under the Private Protective Services Licensing and Regulatory Act. Requires the court to send certain information regarding mental health, domestic assault, and felony indictment to the TBI and the Department of Safety (DOS) to determine an individual's eligibility to purchase a firearm and obtain a handgun carry permit.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures – \$4,000/One-Time

Assumptions:

- According to the DOS, any impact on the operations of the Department will be not significant.
- According to the TBI, additional programming from an outside vendor will be required.
- A one-time increase in state expenditures of \$4,000 for programming costs.
