FISCAL NOTE

SB 1200 - HB 1117

March 8, 2013

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes victims of vehicular assault, criminally negligent homicide, vehicular homicide, reckless homicide and aggravated vehicular homicide, whose injury or death was the result of the use of a motor vehicle or watercraft, to be eligible for compensation through the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund (CICF).

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$529,000/Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund

Increase Federal Expenditures - \$793,500

Assumptions:

- Approximately 229 applicable claims annually.
- Fifty percent of the 229 claims (or 115) are deemed eligible for payments.
- An average cost per payable claim of approximately \$11,500.
- Claims from the CICF are paid with 60 percent federal funds and 40 percent state funds.
- The recurring increase in state expenditures is estimated to be \$529,000 (115 payable claims x \$11,500 x 40% state funds).
- The recurring increase in federal expenditures is estimated to be \$793,500 (115 payable claims x \$11,500 x 60% federal funds).
- Any increase in administrative expenses associated with these claims is estimated to be not significant.
